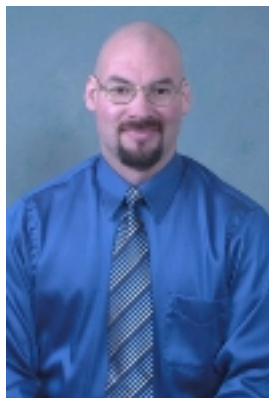

Barton officially off NJCAA probation

Barton County Community College received notification from the NJCAA officially removing them from the probation list at the organization, effective immediately.

According to a letter the college received in late May from NJCAA Executive Committee President Art Becker, "The NJCAA Executive Committee voted to lift the probation period imposed upon the athletic program at Barton County Community College during the 2006-07 academic year. Effective immediately, the sanction of probation will be lifted."

Last season all sports but men's basketball, which had already served a 2-year probation, were placed on probation at the school.

Winter Sports Recap

Lady Cougar basketball ties for first place in West

It wasn't the celebration Barton women's basketball team had hoped for, but it was as good as it could be this year. The Lady Cougars ended the season winning their final 12 games of the year which was the second time in the season they had a 12-game win streak. They finished with a 15-1 record in the West (tied for 1st place with #2 ranked Seward) and 27-3 overall mark - the 3rd best winning percentage (.900) in school history.

Team Highlights

Barton rewrote the school record books in many categories. They set the school record during the year for 3-pointers in a game, season and percentage; record for the fewest turnovers in a season; and finished 2nd in scoring and assists.

Individual Highlights

Four players earned recognition on the All Jayhawk West basketball team. Sophomore point guard Andrea Barber was selected as a 1st team All-West pick. Freshmen Inga Muciniece and LaToya Jackson were selected to the 2nd team and Ipek Turkyilmaz earned honorable mention honors. Barber was also a first-team Region VI pick while Muciniece landed on the honorable mention team. Both Barber and Muciniece were also finalists for the 2007 Kodak/WBCA All-America Basketball Team for Junior Colleges/Community Colleges.

Point guard Andrea Barber led Barton in steals and assists while finishing 2nd in scoring. The sophomore from Topeka finished the year with almost a 3-1 assist to turnover ration. In fact she had by far more steals (78) than turnovers (59).

Barber finished the season averaging 14.0 points, 5.7 assists, and 2.6 steals. She scored a career-high 29 points in a win at Cowley earlier this year – the highest scoring output by a Cougar during the year. Barber's other career highs include 12 rebounds and 10 assists. Barber hit 50 3's and shot 82 percent from the free throw line.

Inga Muciniece



During West play, Inga Muciniece averaged a double-double, scoring 13.3 points and grabbing 12.2 rebounds while blocking 2.7 shots per game. The 6-5 freshman from Latvia finished averaging 9 points, 10.0 rebounds, and 2.1 blocks per game throughout the season.

Muciniece had a season high of 21 points against Pratt and Seward and a high of 22 rebounds against Three Rivers (Mo). She finished the season with 14 double-doubles, including a pair of 4 straight double doubles during West play. Of her 14 double-doubles, 11 came during her 16 conference games. Muciniece had a season-high of 5 blocks and swatted 4 or more shots on 7 occasions.

LaToya Jackson led Barton in scoring this season battling Barber much of the season for the lead. The freshman from Oklahoma City averaged 14.3 points and 4.5 assists per contest.

Jackson picked up her scoring during conference, averaging 15.1 points per contest and was the Cougars top 3-point shooter in West play, hitting 41-of-95 for 43 percent. For the season she finished just behind Turkyilmaz in both 3-point categories. She scored a career-high 25 points in Barton's win over Three Rivers. Jackson posted double figure scoring in 15 of the 16 West games.

Ipek Turkyilmaz's 78 3-pointers were 3 shy of the Barton single-season mark. She hit 78-of-186 for 42 percent to lead what was a team-record 3-point shooting season for the Cougars.

The freshman from Turkey finished the season averaging 10.9 points (4th best on the team), 4.8 rebounds (2nd on team), 2.2 assists, and 1.7 steals per game. Her season-high came at the ShootOut when she scored 23 in a win over Fort Scott. During the ShootOut she averaged 21.5 points a game and made 11 3's in the 2 games, including a season-high 6 in a win over Highland. She had a stretch of 7 West games when she hit at least 3 treys.

Lord resigns to take job at Pittsburg State

The Lane Lord era at Barton County Community College was short but very successful. Coach Lord resigned in April to take over the head coaching position at Pittsburg State University. Lord coached at Barton for 3 season, making 2 trips the Region VI finals and posting a 78-21 overall mark. This past season, Coach Lord guided the Cougars to a 27-3 mark, and finished tied for the top spot in the Jayhawk West.

"Barton and Great Bend have been a great place for me and my family the past 3 years," Coach Lord said. "It is going to be a tough community for us to leave. My wife Stacey, my daughter Logan, and myself have made some life-long friends here and leaving them is going to be very difficult."

Lindley takes over reigns of Barton women's basketball

Chance Lindley was an assistant for the Cougars this past season, helping the club to a 27-3 record. He becomes the 9th coach in school history. Lindley's overall coaching career record is 114-29 at Wichita Collegiate and Wichita Independent high schools.

"This is a tremendous opportunity given to me. I am very excited to be the new coach of the Barton women's basketball team," Coach Lindley said. "I was glad I got the first year as an assistant coach. Moving from high school to college can be done, but sometimes it is one step forward and two steps back," Lindley said. "I really enjoyed the year and to not be thrown into the fire."

"I am very excited to have Chance Lindley take over our women's basketball program. I knew immediately after Coach Lord resigned that Chance should be our next coach," Kohler said. "His coaching philosophy is one that fits well into the vision and mission of Barton County Community College, and this philosophy will be demonstrated in the types of student-athletes he signs to play at Barton."

Cougar's season comes to end in Region VI Title game

It was a season to remember for the Barton men's basketball team. Picked to finish last in the Jayhawk West, the Cougars returned to national prominence coming a game short of the NJCAA National Tournament. Barton made it to the Region VI title game and finished 27-7 on the season.

Team Highlights

Barton finished in a tie for 2nd place in the West after coaches around the conference picked his Cougars to finish 9th – last place – in the pre-season poll. Barton spent most of the season ranked in the Top 20, bolting to a 15-0 and 21-1 start before finishing 3-5 down the stretch and finishing with a regular season 24-6 record.

Individual Highlights

Barton men's basketball coach Craig Fletchall and sophomore Omar Johnson earned high conference honors. Fletchall was tabbed the Coach of the Year in the Jayhawk West and Johnson was picked to the All-West 1st team. In addition to those two selections, Thiago Cordeiro was selected to the 2nd team All-West and Ivan Evans honorable mention. All three players also were named to the All-Region tournament team while Johnson was also a first-team Region VI selection.

Head Coach Craig Fletchall



Coach Fletchall led Barton to a tie for 2nd in the West after coaches around the conference picked his Cougars to finish 9th – last place – in the pre-season poll. Barton spent most of the season ranked in the Top 20, bolting to a 15-0 and 21-1 start before finishing 3-5 down the stretch and finishing with a 24-6 mark and the No. 3 from the West in the upcoming Region VI tournament.

Coach Fletchall is in his 2nd year guiding the Cougars, who finished 18-12 last season but just 6-10 in the West, tied for 8th place. This is the 1st Coach of the Year award for Coach Fletchall, who spent 6 seasons in the Jayhawk East at Neosho before coming to Barton. He is in his 8th season overall with a career mark of 143-76.

Omar Johnson transferred into Barton from the University of Tennessee-Chattanooga and immediately became the team's leading scorer from his point guard spot. The 5-7, sophomore from Philadelphia scored in double figures in all but one contest this season. He led the Cougars with a 17.3 average after spending some of the season scoring better than 20 per game.

Johnson topped the 20-point mark on 10 occasions, scoring a career-high 29 in an overtime win against Brown Mackie. Johnson finished 7th in the West in scoring and led everyone in the West in assists and steals. Johnson handed out 6.5 assists per game and swiped 3.0 steals per contest.

Thiago Cordeiro



Cordeiro was a defensive force for the Cougars, leading the West and nation in blocked shots at 4.2 blocks per contest, a full half-block better than the 2nd best in the West. Cordeiro finished averaging 11.6 points and 8.8 rebounds per game.

The 6-9 sophomore from Brazil had a triple-double in a 55-54 win over Johnson in the Jayhawk Shoot-Out this year, posting 10 points, 10 rebounds, and 10 blocks. It was his 2nd career triple-double after posting an 11-point, 14-rebound, 10-block effort at Seward last season. He finished with 11 double-doubles this season and 16 for his career. He has career highs of 24 points and 22 rebounds.

Another sophomore from Philly, Ivan Evans was 2nd on the team in scoring, assists, and steals and led Barton in rebounding during the 06-07 season. Evans was the only Cougar to top the 30-point mark this season with a 31-point output against Carl Albert (Okla).

Evans finished the year scoring 15.2 points, 9.4 rebounds, 3.4 assists, and 1.6 steals. Evans tied Cordeiro this season with 11 double-doubles. Evans has grabbed 15 or more rebounds on 4 occasions this season with a high of 16 in a 25-point, 16-rebound effort in a road win at Garden.

The Barton softball team finished with the 4th best record in the Jayhawk West at 8-6 and finished overall at 20-37.

Highlights

Despite a couple of tough trips to Texas, the Lady Cougars had many highlights during the season including upsetting two nationally ranked teams on the opponent's home field. The Lady Cougars snapped #11 ranked Seward County's 22 game unbeaten streak and 17 home winning streak with a 5-1 win. Myra Ramos – 2nd Team All West

Myra Ramos, freshman from Uvalde, TX, earned 2nd Team All Jayhawk West. She led the Lady Cougars in batting average, slugging percentage, on-base percentage, runs scored, hits, RBI, HR, total bases, and walks; second on the team in doubles; and third in fielding percentage.



Ruby Reyna – 2nd Team All Region VI

Ruby Reyna, freshman from Sinton, TX, earned 2nd Team All-Region VI honors. She led the Lady Cougars in triples; second on the team in batting average, slugging percentage, on-base percentage, and runs scored; third in hits, RBI, total bases, and walks; and fourth in doubles.

Cougar Baseball finishes 3rd in the West

Barton finished the season winning 5 of their final 6 games and finished with a 34-22 overall record and the 3rd best record in the West at 20-12.

Team Highlights

The Cougars went 34-22 against the perhaps the toughest schedule a Barton team has ever faced. Playing with wood bats, the Cougars went 5-5 on their early season Arizona trip against the best teams in Arizona. As a team, Barton hit .316, scored nearly 7 runs per game, and had 7 players hit better than .300.

Individual Highlights

The team had 9 players selected to the All-Jayhawk West teams, highlighted by a pair of 1st team selections.

Anthony Dreiling – 1st Team All-Jayhawk West

The sophomore shortstop from Lawrence, KS, was the only other Cougar besides Wilson to start all 56 games this season, ending with a .333 average at the plate. Dreiling scored 49 times from this No. 2 spot in the order and drove in 28 runs. His on base percentage of .441, 4 triples, and 5 sacrifice bunts led the Cougars. His 28 walks were 2nd best on the team. Dreiling fielded .906 from one of the most active and error-prone positions in the field, leading Barton with 149 assists.



David Wilson – 1st Team All-Jayhawk West



Wilson capped off a tremendous season with one of the best weekends in Barton history. In his final weekend of play, Wilson went 12-for-15 at the plate with 15 RBI in four games. He also scored 8 times, had 7 doubles, and one home run. For the season, the sophomore from Edmond, OK, led the Cougars with a .385 batting average, 8 home runs (tied for the lead), 67 RBI, 18 doubles and a .620 slugging percentage. He started every game in center field and didn't commit an error during those 56 games in 98 chances and had 6 assists.

Marc Albers – 2nd Team All-Jayhawk West

Second baseman Marc Albers was 1 of 3 freshman earning conference honors. The Lawrence, KS, native helped anchor the middle infield for Barton this season, fielding .954 with 72 assists and was involved in 20 of Barton's 30 double plays. His 151 chances were 4th most on the team. At the plate, Albers hit .333 from near the bottom of the order, where he provided not only a 2nd spark but some punch as well. In addition to scoring 38 times, Albers drove in 21 runs.



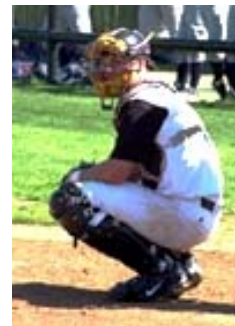
Erik Anderson – 2nd Team All-Jayhawk West



Anderson was the only pitcher to be tabbed All Conference for the Cougars. The freshman closer from Prairie Village, KS, appeared in 27 games and posted a 2.17 ERA with 7 saves this season. He posted some impressive strike out numbers with 76 K's in just 49 2/3 innings of work. He walked just 19 batters and limited the opponents to a .191 batting average. In facing almost 200 batters, he surrendered only 34 hits with only 6 for extra bases.

Tyler Rzepka – 2nd Team All-Jayhawk West

Tyler Rzepka continued the tradition of excellent catchers. In the past five years, 4 Barton catchers have been honored on the All West team. Rzepka threw out 25 percent of the players attempting to steal and was one of the top hitters for Barton at the plate. The sophomore from Overland Park, KS, was one of 7 players for Barton to hit better than .300 as he hit .313 for this season. Rzepka was also 3rd on the team in both slugging percentage (.438) and on base percentage (.435).



Ty Stivers – 2nd Team All-Jayhawk West



The sophomore from Maize, KS, provided utility play for Barton this season, but started the bulk of the games as the Cougars designated hitter. Stivers hit .300 this season, scored 32 times, and collected 30 RBI. His 9 doubles were 3rd on the team as were his 18 walks. Stivers played catcher and 1st base and didn't commit an error in 137 fielding chances. Most of those chances came from the catcher position, where he played 17 games and had 94 chances. He was a perfect 3-for-3 with 2 RBI and 3 runs scored in a pinch-hitting role.

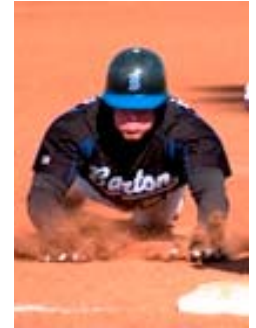

Kenny Burkhead – Hon. Mention All-Jayhawk West

As a freshman this past season, Kenny Burkhead was one of the most dangerous bats in the Cougar lineup. The 1st baseman from Berryton, KS, finished 2nd to Wilson in most of the offensive categories and tied him for the lead with 8 homers. In addition to his co-lead in homers, Burkhead was 2nd on the club with a .367 batting average, 41 RBI, 10 doubles, a .578 slugging percentage, and was 3rd on the team with 45 runs scored. He started 49 games at 1st base with a .984 fielding percentage.



Austin Holt – Hon. Mention All-Jayhawk West



Sophomore Austin Holt got off to a tough start to after being last year's Freshman-of-the-Year in the Jayhawk. But the left fielder from Blue Springs, MO, picked things up the last half of the season, raising his batting average from .190 to .306 by season's end. In the final 27 games of the year, Holt hit .412 with 35 hits, 38 runs scored and 21 RBI. For the year, Holt scored a team-high 56 runs and also led Barton in walks (29), stolen bases (20), and was 2nd in on base percentage (.435). Holt had 32 RBI for the year.

Tyler Metcalf – Hon. Mention All-Jayhawk West

Tyler Metcalf started 49 games for Barton at 3rd base and played in all but one game this season. He also played some 1st base and DH for the Cougars. The sophomore from Wamego, KS, ended the year with a .282 batting average but was 3rd on the team with 39 RBI. Metcalf had 2 homers, 6 doubles, and also scored 37 times.
