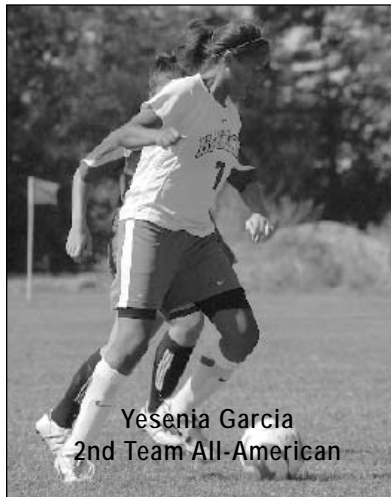

Oliver Twelvetrees finished his 3rd season at Barton as Jayhawk Champions. The team finished 20-0-2 with two all americans. In 2007 the team won the Region VI Championship. The team won a then school record 19 games as Barton finished 19-4 during his 2nd season. In three seasons, Barton is 54-5-2 under Twelvetrees. He guided Barton to its best record ever his 1st season, going 15-1. Barton set a school record with 15 straight wins as well, winning its final 15 games of the season. The Cougars were ineligible for post season play. Barton went unbeaten in Region VI as well the Jayhawk Conference this past season.

Twelvetrees came to Barton from Wayne State (Neb) College, where he was the head coach of the women's soccer team. Twelvetrees spent two seasons at Wayne State, guiding the team to one of its best records ever his final season with an 11-9-3 record. His 2005 team was listed among the Top 15 most improved schools in the NCAA.

Prior to his stint at Wayne State, Twelvetrees was an assistant at Bemidji State University (Minn) for two seasons, also an NCAA Division II school. There the school broke the record for most wins in a season.

Twelvetrees is originally from Wales and played in Europe. He graduated from the University of Brighton in the United Kingdom in 1999. He came to the US in 2000 to serve as a coaching director of a premier junior soccer league in Long Island, NY. He earned his Master's at Bemidji State in 2004.



Bryan Sailer
Barton County
Head Women's Coach

Bryan Sailer finished his 2nd season as Jayhawk Conference Champions. The Women's Soccer Coach ends the schools first ever championship at Barton. In his 1st season, the Cougars won a school record-tying 10 games, going 10-8-2.

Sailer has spent most of the previous 10 years in the Colorado High Schools teaching and coaching soccer. Sailer was the head boys soccer coach at Greeley West High School for 2 seasons, posting a record of 38-29-3 and a Northern Conference Championship.

Prior to that, Sailer coached both the girls and boys at Fort Collins High School. In his 6 years at the helm of the girls, his teams posted an impressive 92-10-3 record, winning the conference championship every year. His teams made it to the 5A semifinals in 2000 and the finals in 2004. He was tabbed as Coach of the Year 3 times, including the State of Colorado Coach of the Year once.

He also coached the men's team for 4 seasons at Fort Collins, going 55-11-3 with 3 conference titles. Twice he was named Coach of the Year on the men's side as well.

Sailer played collegiately at Monroe Community College, perennially one of the top NJCAA teams in the nation. Sailer was an all conference pick at State University of New York-Brockport
